Introduction

Keeping a 4-H record book will help you:

- Organize yourself
- Set reasonable goals
- Appreciate what you've learned this year
- Recognize what you've learned and track your progress from year to year
- Explain what you've learned
- Keep track of costs of your project
- Gather information needed to apply for awards and scholarships
- Complete applications and resumes
- Meet requirements to participate in some county, state and national 4-H events.

Guidelines for the Cat Project Record Book

- 1. Exhibitors who are exhibiting a cat/kitten are <u>required</u> to complete a Cat Project Record Book. One record book can be completed for all of your project animals.
- 2. Start your record book at the beginning of the 4-H year (in September or when you join 4-H) and keep track of all your expenses and receipts during the year. It is important to update your record book monthly. Keep your book neat and complete.
- 3. Exhibitors are to include clear photographs of project animal. Photos should be permanently mounted and labeled with the name of the exhibitor and cat/kitten. Additional pages may be added for pictures.
- 4. It is recommended that exhibitors include records books from the previous years to show improvement in the project area.
- 5. It is recommended that exhibitors put the Project Books in a notebook or binder to protect the pages. Plastic page protectors and dividers are acceptable, but are not mandatory.
- 6. Project books will be judged on neatness and completeness. Presentation may also be considered.




