

Faults and Disqualifications

Determine which of the following are faults and which are disqualifications Utilizing (F) and (D), respectively, to indicate your selections.

Faults are imperfections. Conditions or characteristics that are unacceptable and will result in a lower show placing but not a disqualification.

Disqualifications are one or more permanent defect, deformities, or blemishes that make a rabbit unfit to be registered, to win an award in competition, or to take part in an exhibition.

1.) Foreign Color Patch—White spot in colored area of the fur coat or colored spot in white area of the fur coat plane, instead of a vertical plane.
 2.) Wry Tail—Abnormal tail—bent, carried, or twisted permanently to one side (corkscrew tail with one or more turns).
 3.) Pinched hindquarters—Hindquarter tapering towards the tail, giving a pinched appearance.
 4.) Sore Hock—An ulceration of the foot pad. Can occur on either hind or front feet.
 5.) Abcess—A localized area of inflammation caused by an infection under the skin, in a gland, or in a hair follicle.
 6.) Hutch stain—Urine and/or manure stains on fur.

1) The white marking found on the face of a Dutch. It should be medium wide and wedge shaped, covering the nose, whisker bed, and tapering up to the ears, where it joins the hair line.	Rust
2) A strong basal ridge of cartilage at the top of the head, forming the ear base on some lop eared breeds.	Crown
3) Teeth which only meet and do not achieve the required upper incisor overbite of the lower incisors.	Fiber
4) An extra toe or functionless digit on the inside of the front legs.	Dew Claw
5) The individual hair that combines with others to compose a coat of fur/wool.	Molt
6) A gradual return of the fur to its normal position when stroked from hindquarters to the shoulders.	Pegged Teeth
7) The act of shedding or changing fur.	Open Coat
8) Non-wool coat lacking the ability to return to its natural position when stroked toward the head due to molt.	Rollback
